You may also vote for candidate(s) of another Party, in a specific contest, by completely darkening the oval next to his or her name. This action will not void your Straight Party vote for other candidates, in other contests.
- 3. To cast a write-in vote for a person whose name is not on the ballot, you must blacken the oval to the left of the line provided, and print the name in the blank space provided for that purpose.

  4. To vote in FAVOR of a Question, fill in the oval to the left of the word YES. To vote AGAINST a Question, fill in the oval to the left of the word NO.
- Use only a black pen or marker.
   If you make a mistake <u>DO NOT ERASE</u>. Ask for a new ballot.
