2018 Voter Turnout and Election Policy by State: What Can We Learn?



History was made in 2018 as voters across the country turned out in numbers not seen in a midterm election in over 100 years. When measured against the voting-eligible population, voter turnout was 50.3%, the highest midterm turnout since 1914 and the largest increase from a previous midterm in U.S. history.

But beneath this record turnout is a more important and informative story. Despite the record turnout nationwide, vast differences in voter turnout between states persisted – differences driven largely by election-related policies.
